What most Washington Catholics are not aware of, however, is how Gregory, the NAC Board of Governors, and the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Christophe Pierre, are accused of failing to act on the predatory and misconduct allegations they received involving Fathers Harman and Park that were found to be credible by a former Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Special Agent in Charge (SAC).
